

# A message from Rev Rachel.

August 2024

#### Dear Friends,

#### Is this magazine important to you? We need to know!

Last year, I discovered that I had some neglected some potatoes in a cupboard. These potatoes were so far gone, I decided to plant them. A little time later we had produced a few potatoes, and my girls were over the moon. So much so that my eldest has asked could we grow more potatoes – more intentionally – this year. And this week (at time of writing) we have started digging up and eating them, and they are delicious!

There's something quite exciting about digging up potatoes - you don't know what exactly you're going to get. (This brings to mind one memorable All Age service at All Saints when we dug up our potatoes along with an ants nest!) How many will we find? How big will they be? How many delicious meals can we make? We sow the seeds (or seed potatoes) in faith, and water them in faith, but we don't know what the harvest will be like.

St Paul uses gardening imagery to describe the growth of the church. He talks about how each of us have a role to play, but it is God that gives the growth. All Saints is a church that is committed to growing in faith, growing in number and growing in the good we do in our community. We are delighted to see signs of that fruitfulness in lots of different ways – more baptisms, growth in our groups such as Knead and huge numbers benefitting from Picnic in the Park – and we thank God for them. But there are lots of things that are harder to measure and assess – and one of these we need your help with.

#### Parish Council News - August

At the meeting of the Full Council held on Monday 5<sup>th</sup> August 2024, seven councillors were present.

District Councillor Ann Hooks was also in attendance.

Two members of the public were welcomed to the meeting and the issue of articulated lorries using

Capel Road was raised. Over recent months, lorries have been turning into Capel Road from Shalford Road and are then having to reverse out once they realise they cannot get onto the main road. Signage was therefore requested to notify drivers that this was not a route to the B1256. The council advised that they would contact Highways in the first instance to see what action can be taken.

The council currently have 2 vacancies, 1 of which was advertised in July. We had 1 candidate apply and they were successfully co-opted – please welcome Julie Richards (photo to follow).

2 I have attended a meeting of the Old School Room, to see and hear about the great work that is being done to improve the building.





In one hour, 12 vehicles were recorded, (with the highest being 50 & 45mph), over the speed limit at Duck End Green. Details are passed on the police and those concerned will receive a letter from Essex Police. The voluntary speedwatch team are dedicated to keeping our village safe from speeding drivers, but to be more effective they need more members. Training is required, this is in the form of a two hour online course. Please get in contact if you are interested.


I attended BDCs full council and supported a motion that recognises the importance of maintaining our nation's food security and the role our District farmers pay in feeding the county and protecting our countryside. This is a timely motion in light of the publication of the call for sites and the review of the Local Plan

2 I have supported residents on a range of issues across the Ward. Including parking tickets, parking in general & issues with the DiGigo.

Did you know that the new Victoria Street carpark has direct access to the Livewell Hub, from inside the public carpark? I will admit I didn't, until I did some investigating for a resident!

Il have raised the issue of the overgrown vegetation, that is covering the whole of the pavement and causing a dangerous situation on Rayne Road. Hopefully between my neighbouring Ward Councillor, ECC and the landowner, this will have been sorted by the time you read this.





Local Plan review. Braintree District Council is currently going through a review process of its Development Plan. To keep the Plan current and up to date it is required to be reviewed every 5 years. The current plan runs to 2033 but the review will extend it to 2041. BDC are working to very tight deadlines, with submission of the updated Plan to be with the Secretary of State by 30<sup>th</sup> June 2025.

#### SO WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR RAYNE?

A Call for Sites exercise occurred in the spring. This is where landowners and developers can nominate land to be included in the Local Plan.

At the end of July, Parish Councils were notified of nominated land in their areas. The Rayne Ward, including Rayne, Salings and Blake End has proposed 13 sites. Along with neighbouring sites in the West of Braintree that includes the "Brook Green" land. During September BDCs Local Plan Committee will rigorously debate each site. Each site is assessed for its suitability, availability and achievability for development. Parish Councils have the opportunity to provide comments to Officers on each site. Both Rayne and Saling PCs worked hard in the very short time frame to get their comments to BDC by mid August.

Once BDC has chosen the sites it wishes to put into the reviewed Local Plan, there will be a regulation 18 six week public consultation. This will happen winter 2024.

I have supported both Rayne and Saling in their submissions to officers and will be attending all Local Plan Committee meetings.

One last thing....

I have been asked by Marina of Brunwin Road, to say a huge thank you to all Rayne residents that were so helpful and supportive, when her house was damaged by the recent fire. The community spirit was so strong in our road that day and the days following it.

#### Wildlife Reports, till July 2024

I am sorry there was no report last month which was due to me. (It was included in the online versions on the Church and the Parish websites. Ed)

**Tim Wignall,** Pound Farm Cottage is a regular contributor to this wildlife report so I asked Tim if he feeds his birds as he is surrounded by arable fields which rarely provide food for wildlife. Tim has 3 feeders with sunflower hearts, two lots of fat balls, puts meal worms on the feeders and feeds peanuts autumn and winter. The Blue and Great Tits are credited with removing bugs from Tim's trees including his apples. No wonder Tim always has a long list of birds frequenting his garden. On 10/6 Tim was rewarded with baby Blue Tits in the garden, he also recorded a Wren, a Buzzard, a pair of Red Leg Partridges and Badger droppings near his cottage.

Ken Turner gave us a pot of compost which contained three large larvae. They were very fat and curved in a C shape about 25mm long and whitish in colour, see the picture. They were either the larvae of a *Stag Beetle* or *Cockchafer* Beetle. We believe it was the former, which can grow to 8cms long and are usually found in rotting wood. They are now very scarce, and the larvae were placed back in similar conditions. The adult is one of our largest beetles and its huge antlers shaped like 'stags horns' are used to fight off rivals. It is said that their numbers appear to



be stable in this country but have had major declines in Europe. I have only ever seen one live adult beetle which was very impressive.



Beryl Whiteside 21/6 reported Agrimony which has yellow flowers on the footpath from the Street to Duckend Green. Beryl also reminded me of the *Pyramidal Orchids* that she first reported on the embankment to the Fentons footbridge over the A120 from the Dunmow roundabout. The slip road from the roundabout onto the dual carriage way of the A120 has a greater number of orchids than the footway. If you investigate the slipway banks for the orchids, be careful of the road traffic which is travelling at very high speeds to join the A120. One patch had over 20 flowers. The embankments where the orchids are flowering are not cut and the grass and shrub growth is poor so there is no major competition for the orchids. Hopefully Beryl will continue to monitor this site for the future of the orchids.

Andy Goodey 2/7 saw two Marbled White butterflies, his first for Rayne in the meadow opposite the 47 restaurant. The white butterfly has black markings on its wings which makes it very distinctive. They can be seen feeding on the

purple flowers of Field Scabious, Common Knapweed and Wild Marjoram. The caterpillars feed on a variety of grasses. I believe this butterfly has not been recorded in Rayne before.

Phyl Monk 2/7 found a Gypsy Moth caterpillar on his Black Currant bush. I am reluctant to ask Phil how good his Black Currants were this year. This caterpillar when it is present in large numbers can strip a large tree of all its foliage in one season. I hope Phyl has only one lodger living on his Black Currants.



On 12/7 Phil walked along Pods Brook and saw 6 Yellow Hammers, 2 Little Owls in a dead tree in the field bordering the development at Rayne Gardens, 9 Blackbirds, a Song Thrush, several flying Sky Larks and heard an unseen Bullfinch.



**Adele Ferguson,** Medley House 13/6 has had regular visits by a *male Sparrow Hawk* to the garden. It was also helping itself to snacks from the local bird life as witnessed by her photograph.

Tim Wignall 7/7 had a 2ft Grass Snake in the garden and two sightings of a Weasel. The latter are rarely seen in the Parish. Tim has also had visits from a white pheasant. The latter is probably an escape from someone's collection. Tim also sent a picture of Cinnabar Moth caterpillars on Ragwort by his cottage.

At Goulds we have four Hares that appear every evening when the farmyard is empty. If not chasing each other they spend their time eating certain plants in the mown grass. The Kestrel has fledged at least 3 young. I never checked to see how many of the five eggs hatched.

The Moorhens have produced five young from two families. The parents are having major battles between them over who should have access to certain parts of the garden.
